POST-ADOPTION AND COUNSELING SERVICES



EVERY PERSON

entering the adoption process brings with them their history, values and beliefs. At times, our experiences can be our greatest assets or our greatest weaknesses. Although foster and adoptive parents undergo countless hours of training prior to placement, parenting often presents unique and unexpected challenges that may require clinical assistance or coaching, particularly when faced with trauma, loss, or abusive experiences that their child may have faced in their history. Foster and adoptive parents, the adopted person and birth family members face ambiguous loss and adverse childhood experiences that may develop into chronic or complicated grief years following the placement of a child. Adopted persons will face different questions about identity throughout their lives and may desire to put pieces of their history together or process experiences related to their adoption.



We offer individual and family clinical counseling with licensed professionals to all foster and adoptive families, adopted persons and birthparents. We also offer the following:
